Window Replacement and Outside Painting of the Community House

Property Committee will be bringing a proposal to a called Business Meeting on May 31, 2015. A named Friend from Property Committee, rather than me, will be the "clerk of the works" of this project, due to the extensive nature of the project.

Use of the Buildings by Others

The Westport River Garden Club just had a very successful sale last weekend at the Community House. They use the grounds for 2 consecutive days over Memorial Day weekend for this amazing sale, and they are mostly wonderfully self-sufficient (we're working on some minor clarity around recycling and clean up responsibilities). Young Friends held a retreat here a couple of weeks ago, and the JHYM 8th Grade Retreat is next weekend. Youth Programs' retreats do require more time from me before and after – but it is a good bit of ministry! We've had a couple of inquiries, were the rain location for a non-profit's gathering, and hosted one birthday party.

I have had long phone calls, an in-person meeting, and exchanged a number of emails with someone interested in hosting a regular music series at the Community House. Property Committee will be considering this proposal at its next meeting.
