Use of the Buildings

- The Community House kitchen passed the annual Health Department inspection in June.
- The 2 water tests since the installation of the water softener treatment have come back indicating the water in the Community House is potable. To my mind, this property improvement decision was well worth the cost.
- The annual inspection of all of the fire extinguishers is scheduled for this week.
