Painting the Meeting House

The white walls and ceilings are done in the main room and the foyer. Jamie, our painter through Rick Messier, is now onto the grey trim. He's currently using the 10 gallons of Premium Behr paint which I found down in the basement (previously found by Deana and Buddy under the stairs in the Meeting House) that were purchased in 2001. He's an excellent painter. (FYI: He was the one, working with Stan Stopka, who painted ALL of the new Partners Village Store.) The one additional bit of work we've agreed upon is for him to paint the foyer floor. (Yes. He'll take the runner up.) I met with he and Billy Shaw, the project manager for Messier's, and we worked out how to coordinate the timing of the painting and carpeting. Jamie will do the trim first, and then the carpeting will (hopefully) happen, followed by painting the benches. Have I already mentioned how fabulous these guys are to work with?

Carpeting

Thanks to Kevin who delivered the carpet choice to Morency early this week. They should have received the deposit check from us by now, and the carpet ordering should be in the works. We are hoping that they can install it April 11-12, per the conversation mentioned above. It's a tight deadline for Morency, so this may not work.....but we can hope.

Electrical and Fire Safety Work in the Meeting House

Jeff Kobza finished up his work for us today. The green exit signs look way better than the red. The ones in the main part of the Meeting House are *not* **un**-noticeable....prep yourselves for the jolt – but we had no choice in the size. He did excellent, neat and tidy work, though – really impressively clean.

All Security has installed the radio antenna in the attic of the Meeting House. They will not install the rest of the fixtures until all of the painting is done – so after today, they will be off site for a couple of weeks.

Electrical (especially Thermostats) and Fire Safety Work in the Community House

As a favor, Jeff installed the programmable thermostat in the FDS classroom today. I believe I programmed it correctly so that the room is warm Amy and the FDS crew on Sunday mornings. I completely reprogrammed the one in the main hall after last Sunday's disappointing performance, and I have been checking on it all week – I am optimistic it will work, though I realize many others ahead of me have thought the same thing.....

All Security installed the new alarm box, radio box, and smoke detector in the entranceway and the outside strobe light all this week. The Community House is now completely ready to be radio monitored to All Security's system. Their work in this building is done. They will wait until all of the work in the Meeting House is done before contacting the fire and building inspectors for walk throughs.

I, again, did not make progress on the fire extinguisher research – but I will have to next week, as these must be up to date before that inspection happens. I also have to figure out how to change those bulbs and/or batteries in some of the emergency lights that are not currently working.....

The Basement

Last Sunday afternoon, Buddy discovered that the basement was flooded with 2 inches of water. Seems the sump pump was unplugged at some point. We turned it on and watched the water recede. I used the space heater a couple of days to ensure the dampness was gone as much as possible. Seems okay now. We need to organize a work crew to clear out and organize that area at some point this spring.

Exercise and Flexibility Classes start April 1

Deana offered to return the 2 very large tubs that have been there for some time, left by a previous yoga teacher.

One of Mary's regular clients showed up one morning this week – thinking the classes had already moved from Tiverton. He reminded me a lot of our dear Friend Frank Lepreau – elderly, slow moving, and arthritic. I am impressed that Mary gets people like this man to her classes. She says she has many like him, and that one of her goals is to keep people moving, and to help them do things like 'get off the floor' more easily! Maybe we all need to go. ©
