- a few Westport Friends, as the year began, standing with many others in the Community Peace Vigil; yellow ribbons around our trees, as requested by our Young People to show concern for all involved; then green ribbons and white doves added for life and peace;
- Bumper Stickers, bright red, white and blue, designed and produced by our Peace & Social Concerns Committee, and asking, "Why #1 on War, But # 23 in Infant Care?";
- our own Tent at the Book Sale covering more books than ever before, and a larger number of other wares, too;
- a work crew starting to restore the shed to useful service and build new storage area on the foundations of old horse stalls;
- cars parked almost every day outside the Community House because our buildings are used by community and civic groups;
- baggage and bedding piled on the ramp of the Community House after Elementary, Junior High or Young Adult retreats had been held at Westport;
- all young people taking part in the Christmas Eve Service, and afterwards, the traditional breaking of the pinata;
- Bright Blue Sundays, those fifth Sundays of a month, when we all worship together;
- coffee hours after meeting with toothsome snacks and earnest or frivolous conversation undisturbed by dog or children running about;
- a glowing fire in the fireplace, now made useable by chimney repair and a new glass fire screen;
- cases of Rain Forest Crunch, sold by Young Friends, to help send four from Westport to Youth Quake at Burlington, VT, at the end of the year.
