How can the Meeting nurture our community to be open to the movements of the spirit and be faithful to them in worship and in our daily lives?

We find joy in being with each other in spirit as Seekers. We feel the gentleness of the spirit at work in our life. As one Friend offered, Meeting is like the waves hitting and washing over the rocks, gradually and gently wearing down the hardness of the world; gently teaching us, smoothing us out.
